

Parent-Teacher Home Visit Procedure

Teachers conduct at least two home visits per program year for each family to engage the parents in the child's learning and development, except that such visits may take place at the program site or another safe location that affords privacy at the parent's request, or if a visit to the home represents significant safety hazards for staff.

First Home Visit-Individual Education Plan

The first home visit is scheduled at the beginning of the year upon completion of the children's first developmental assessment. Teachers and parents share and discuss the process and their children's assessment results. Together the teachers and parents create an Individualized plan for each child based on data from their assessment which focus on the progress and development of School Readiness goals. If a child has an Individual Family Service Plan or Individual Education Plan is on file, teachers and parents discuss child's goals.

Second Home Visit

The second home visits scheduled during middle of the school year, after the Midyear assessment has been completed. Teachers and parents share and discuss the children's assessment results and developmental growth. Together teachers and parents review the School Readiness goals that were selected during the home visit, teachers provide additional support if needed. If a child has an Individual Family Service Plan or Individual Education Plan is on file, teachers and parents discuss progress and additional support if needed.
